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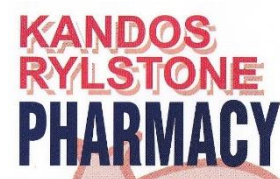

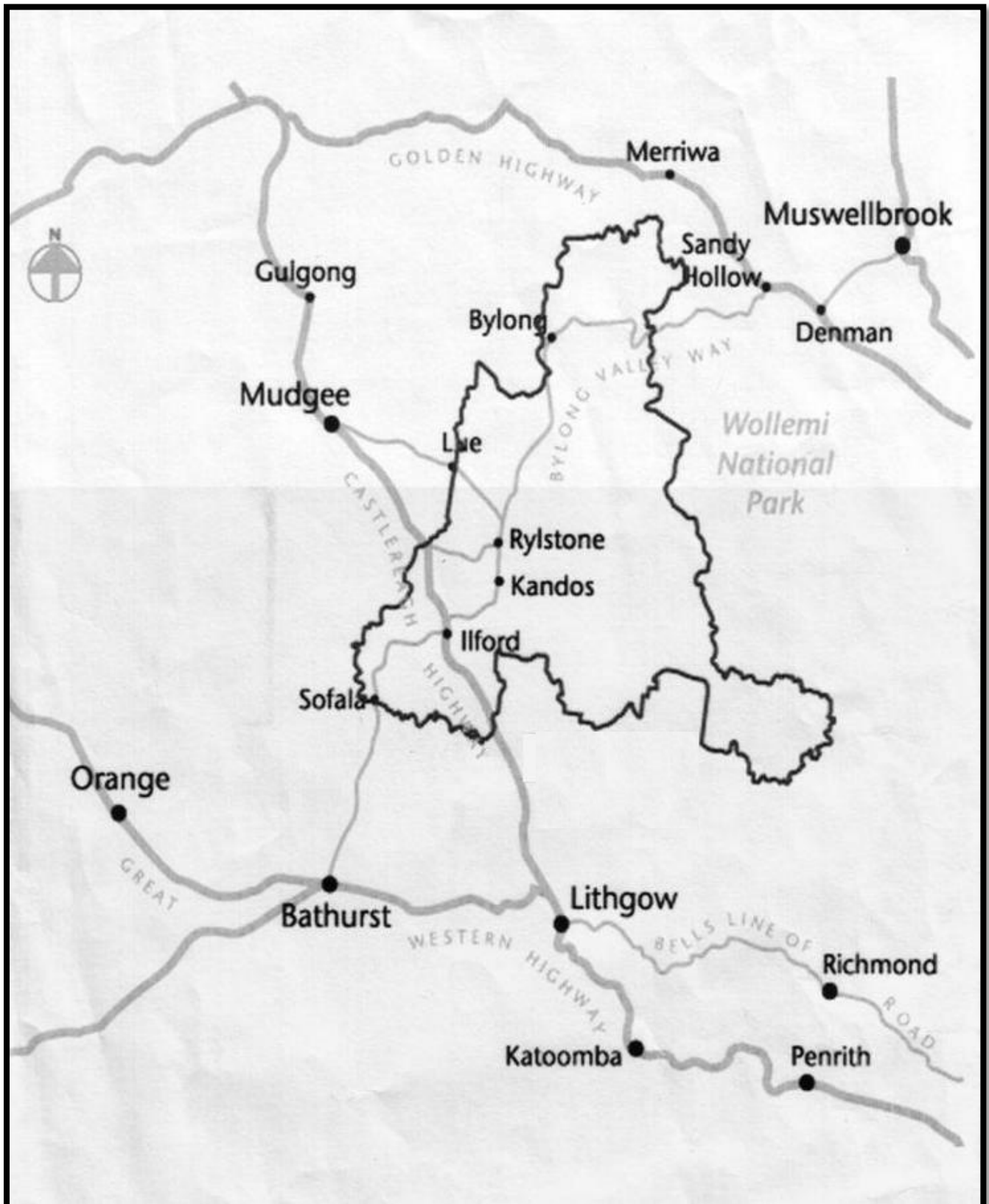

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR COMPETITORS:

- Extra parking available for floats and horse trucks/goosenecks – enter through gateway next to Prices' Service Centre and receive directions.
- Ring crew will be wearing bright shirts. Crew are available to provide assistance and direction.
- Drug Testing may be carried out at this show. Any competitor found to have breached the ASC Disputes and Disciplinary regulations will be investigated by the ASC Disciplinary Committee
- Warming up allowed in ring until 8am sharp.
- ALL DOGS must be TIED UP or on a LEASH

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- ALL COMPETITORS COMPETE AT THEIR OWN RISK
- No competitor will be eligible to compete in any ring event unless the competitor (if over 18), or parent or guardian (if under 18) has signed a waiver and is wearing a wrist band.
- All protests must be made in writing and addressed to the Ring Secretary within 30 minutes of the event, accompanied by a protest fee of \$50 (**non-refundable**).
- The judge has the right to disqualify any entry that does not conform to the schedule. Judge's decision is final.
- Competitors only to enter the ring. Spectators and others are not permitted within the ring and must leave when instructed. All competitors must be ready to compete when called.
- All competitors must wear approved safety equipment appropriate to their event. This rule will be strictly adhered to, there are no exceptions.
- Children under 18 years are not permitted to exhibit or lead a stallion or colt.
- Stallions and colts may compete in jumping and designated stallion classes only.
- Stallions and colts to be controlled with a bit or chain and double-tied at all times.
- Show Hunter Ponies, Galloways and Hacks must nominate in **EITHER** Show Hunter classes or Open Hack classes **NOT BOTH**.
- NOVICE:** Horse or rider that has not won a first prize in a similar event at any ASC Show.
- INTERMEDIATE:** A horse that has not won an individual ribbon in any hack event at any Royal Show.
- LOCAL CLASSES:** Ponies, Galloways and Hacks include both open horses and hunter horses in local classes only. Local classes are for LOCAL FULL-TIME RESIDENT horses and riders. Refer to local map in the program. Any competitors presenting from outside the local area will be refused entry into class. In the event of any dispute, proof will be required. Failure to provide proof may result in refusal to enter the class.
- Horses must be registered with the relevant Society & be current Financial Members.**
- All horses in Breed Classes **must** be registered with the APPROPRIATE SOCIETY to enter class. **BREED PAPERS AND MEMBERSHIP STATUS** must be available upon request. If you don't have relevant documents if requested, you may be refused entry into the class.
- Riders can only be led where stated in the program.
- Classes will not be delayed for a competitor to present to the judge, except for Championship classes.

1. Competitors will be judging pens of commercial sheep and lambs as opposed to stud sheep. This will give them an opportunity to learn about and be exposed to animals they are likely to encounter in most sheep farming situations.
2. Separate competitions will be held for merino ewes and meat lambs.
3. Competitors to be between 12 and 18 years of age on the day of the show. If there are sufficient numbers, a 12 to 15 years class and a 16 to 18 years class will be held.
4. An experienced industry individual will be appointed as judge for the competition and will also provide comments, feedback and encouragement to competitors.

Conditions

1. Competitors must be appropriately dressed (boots or fully covered shoes are required).
2. Competitors must respect the welfare of the sheep and lambs at all times.
3. The judge's decision is final regarding the placing of animals and points awarded in assessments.
4. A perpetual trophy will be awarded the "Most Successful School" in the Junior Judging competitions at the Rylstone-Kandos Show. This will be decided by awarding 3 points for first, 2 points for second and 1 point for third in each of
5. the Beef Cattle, Merino Sheep and Meat Lamb sections with the school gaining the highest number of points declared the winner.

Merino Section

3. Competitors will be asked to provide 4 written assessments of each pen.

These assessments will cover:

1. Suitability to industry requirements (up to 5 points), Carcass quality (up to 5 points)
2. Skin quality (up to 5 points), Other comments (up to 5 points)

HISTORY OF THE CJ SAVILLE CUP

Christopher James Saville arrived in Portland from England in about 1910 and worked for his much older cousin, John Saville Snr, who was the manager of the Standard Portland Cement Co. (and grandfather of Sue Thorne, nee Saville).

After working in Portland for some years and marrying a local girl, Lee, Chris moved to Charbon, to open and manage the cement works there for the Company. Here he became friendly with Jack Blackmore, the founder and President of the RKSS. The CJ Saville Cup was given to the RKSS either by Chris himself or his family after his death, as a memorial trophy. Chris died in 1948 aged 61 and is buried in Rylstone Cemetery. It is thought that he died while still manager at the Cement Works.

P & V Hall Youth Achievement Award will be awarded to the local exhibitor under the age of 25 gaining the most points for exhibits in the hall.

Points will be awarded based on 2 points for each 1st prize and 1 point for each 2nd prize gained. The shield/cup/trophy remains the property of the RKSS. INGREDIENTS:

250g sultanas	1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg
250 g chopped raisins	1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
250 g currants	1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
125 g chopped mixed peel	250g butter
90 g chopped red glace cherries	250g soft brown sugar
90 g chopped blanched almonds	½ teaspoon lemon essence OR finely
1/3 cup sherry or brandy	grated lemon rind
250 g plain flour	½ teaspoon almond essence
60 g self-raising flour	½ teaspoon vanilla essence
4 large eggs	

RECOMMENDED METHOD:

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.

Sift together the flours and spices

Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after, each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

Place the mixture into a prepared square 20cm x 20cm (8" x 8") tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

Note: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

WOOL ARTICLE/GARMENT STATE COMPETITION

Competition to be conducted at Society, Group & State Level

Conditions:

1. For the purpose of this competition the following definitions apply:
 - a) Garment: an item that can be worn eg. dress, jacket, scarf, hat
 - b) Article: a utility item that is not worn but can be used in the home eg. blanket; with an outfit eg. bag; for amusement eg. toy; as a decoration eg. picture etc.
 - c) Three Different Types: the 3 items in an entry must differ from each other in terms of their construction technique and/or their purpose eg.1 a knitted jumper, blanket and tea cosy OR eg.2 a knitted tea cosy, a crocheted tea cosy or a felted tea cosy OR eg.3 a knitted jumper, a knitted blanket and a crocheted blanket.
2. All articles/garments must contain a minimum of 80% sheep wool, excluding lining, to qualify for competition.
3. Exhibits (articles/garments) may be knitted, crocheted, sewn, felted etc and must be hand crafted (use of machine is permitted).
4. A sample of the yarn, fabric or fibre with label must be attached to each item making up the exhibit. If a label is not available such as in the case of a hand spun or felted item, a handwritten label with relevant details and sample will suffice."
5. An exhibit in this competition may consist of the work of one individual or a group of individuals, or an organisation.
6. All three article/garments must have been completed within the 12 months prior to the local show and made by the exhibitor/s.
7. An exhibit having won at a local show may be exhibited (the same three article/garments) at the Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final is then eligible to compete in the State Final.
8. An exhibit is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level and one Group at State level.
9. An exhibit (article/garment) that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again.
10. If this class is not scheduled or attracts no entries at a local show, the Chief Pavilion Steward in consultation with the appropriate Pavilion Section Judges, may select three suitable individual exhibits and, with the exhibitor's permission, enter them in the Group judging as an exhibit representing the particular Society concerned.
11. It is the responsibility of the Group Secretary and winner to co-ordinate the transfer of the winning entry to the ASC Office in Sydney for the State judging.
12. Recommendation: State Final garments are to include a photo of the garment being worn (where possible and applicable).
